As the author describes in an article published in the Lusitano Bulletin Volume 20 issue No 4: "This second volume was written to add about 200 more photographs and give the readers a brief perspective of what life was like in Hong Kong shortly before and after World War II. The 5 written chapters of the book are:

Chapter I The Portuguese Community in Hong Kong (1900-41)

Chapter II The Japanese Occupation & the Prisoners of War (1941-45)

Chapter III The Community after World War II

Chapter IV Social Life of the Community (1946-68)

Chapter V Those Who Stayed

The Appendix includes 4 maps of the areas where the Portuguese lived in Hong Kong and Kowloon with list of many families who lived in the areas of Mato Morro, Tsim Sha Tsui, Homuntin, and Kowloon Tong."

### **ALL ROADS LEAD BACK TO HONG KONG**

*"Stand There Against The Wall, You Two, And Look At The Camera"* belted the father of Eddie Cruz Jr. some 52 years ago. Most reluctantly and with the sun in their eyes, Judy Rocha (Casa de Macau Australia) and Eddie (Casa de Macau, Toronto) did just that!!! Not only were they class



mates, they were such good friends that they sat next to each other for two consecutive years!! The finishing bell had rung at St. Paul's Convent School in Causeway Bay, Hong Kong, and they were anxious to go home. However, the two 8-year-olds had no choice but to listen to the Voice of Authority! Little would they know that photo, which each had a copy and kept for more than five decades, would bring them back together to (almost) the same spot.

Primary 5 came and because of the then education system, Judy and Eddie were forced to part – Eddie to St. Joseph's College and later emigrated to Toronto while Judy remained in St. Paul's and ultimately settled in Sydney. They had no contact or communication with each other since 1960.

Two years ago, after seeing Judy's name listed as a committee member in the Newsletter of Casa Australia, Eddie contacted his first cousin, Yvonne Herrero, who was then its President. This led to Judy and Eddie re-establishing contact and left them with 50 years of catching-up to do. Since they are living at opposite ends of the world, Hong Kong, their "heung ha" seemed the most appropriate place to meet up which they did last November.

A visit to their *Alma Mater* was a must. Alas, all the school buildings have been replaced and any attempt to create a "before and after" photo was thwarted as the now-legendary wall before which Judy and Eddie stood half a century ago, was no longer there!! The only structure from the past is the school's impressive Christ the King Chapel. "That would do!" Amid curious glances from those leaving after the morning mass, Judy and Eddie, this time most willingly and obligingly, assumed their respective poses for a photo which had its beginning way back in history!! It was their own special "Encontro". *Amigos Sempre!!*
